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WOMEN'S DAY CELEBRATION

Significance of the day was shared and a quiz "Guess Who?" was also conducted to identify the woman achievers from past and present.



TOBACCO CONTROL AWARENESS PROGRAM

A session on 'Tobacco Control' was organized by PHCER on the March 15, 2014. The guest speaker was from 'Salaam Bombay Foundation'--- India's largest NGO focusing on tobacco control in children. This foundation develops the personality of children by instilling confidence and their ability to withstand peer pressure. It carries out activities in co-operation with schools and colleges. The Foundation representative Shri Pranit A. Ghodke, explained pictorially about the types of tobacco products. He elaborated on the effects of

consumption of such tobacco products, with visuals of patients affected by the same. He also enlisted the symptoms of cancer which is a consequence of such consumptions. The discussion enabled the student-teachers to arrive at the conclusion that 'Prevention is better than cure'. Few short films and street plays were also shown to make the program more effective.



HOLI CELEBRATION

The festival of colours was organised by the student-teachers with great zeal. They highlighted the significance of the festival with a colourful power point presentation. Student-teachers shared poems on 'Holi'. A game was also organized based on 'Holi' songs from hindi movies.
